traces a day in the life of an american college student that challenges popular conceptions of ivy accented campuses with images of culturally reflective t shirts keg parties and dormitory life to reveal how college represents opportunities for enabling a sustainable future

first published in 1962 frederick rudolph s groundbreaking study the american college and university remains one of the most useful and significant works on the history of higher education in america bridging the chasm between educational and social history this book was one of the first to examine developments in higher education in the context of the social economic and political forces that were shaping the nation at large surveying higher education from the colonial era through the mid twentieth century rudolph explores a multitude of issues from the financing of institutions

and the development of curriculum to the education of women and blacks the rise of college athletics and the complexities of student life in his foreword to this new edition john thelin assesses the impact that rudolph s work has had on higher education studies the new edition also includes a bibliographic essay by thelin covering significant works in the field that have appeared since the publication of the first edition at a time when our educational system as a whole is under intense scrutiny rudolph s seminal work offers an important historical perspective on the development of higher education in the united states

college tuition has risen more rapidly than the overall inflation rate for much of the past century to explain rising college cost the authors place the higher education industry firmly within the larger economic history of the united states
