historian robert gellately firmly rejects both these simplifications of the man and his motives using a wealth of previously unavailable documentation gellately shows instead how stalin's crimes are more accurately understood as the deeds of a ruthless and life long leninist revolutionary far from being a latter day red tsar intent simply upon imperial expansion for its own sake stalin was in fact deeply inspired by the rhetoric of the russian revolution and what lenin had accomplished during the great war as gellately convincingly shows stalin remained throughout these years steadfastly committed to a boundless faith in communism and saw the second world war as his chance to take up once again the old revolutionary mission to carry the red flag to the world
